Dr. Linda F. Marcell, an ordained minister and founding president of Agape Global Missions, a mission organization based in Inglewood, California and Uganda, East Africa, has several responsibilities as a fulltime missionary.

A former educator in the public school system and crisis counselor in the U.S, Dr. Marcell has worked much with abused women and children, and has served as a crisis responder for the Salvation Army Disaster Relief for Hurricane Katrina Recovery as well as trauma counseling trainer in response to the 1994 genocide recovery in Kigali, Rwanda and The Crisis in Northern Uganda.

The extent of her ministerial call has included teaching in Bible schools and church plants in remote areas of India, South Korea, China, South America, Jamaica, Mexico and various countries in Africa. Dr. Marcell has served the Body of Christ in numerous capacities such as: Pastor of Counseling and Director of Social Services at her church, Leader of Missions/Evangelism Ministry as well as Director of Christian Education,

Dr. Marcell holds a Ph.D. in Christian Psychology from Jacksonville Theological Seminary in Jacksonville, Florida, a Masters in Education from Freed-Hardeman University in Henderson, Tennessee, a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Lane College in Jackson, Tennessee, a diploma in Christian Education and a diploma in Theology from American Baptist College in Nashville, Tennessee and has taken courses in missions from Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, California, along with numerous other trainings, and courses on various topics.

Dr. Marcell is a member of the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation, Inc. (ICISF), a member of the American Association of Christian Counselors, The Uganda Counseling Association, the Christian Association of Psychological Studies, Black African American Christian Counselors, and member of the Movement of African National Initiatives (MANI).

As a counseling psychologist, Dr. Marcell has developed a three level trauma counseling curriculum that is being used in her mobile school called “Ray of Hope School of Trauma Counseling” which is being taken into various war-torn areas to train pastors, health care and other professionals in crisis intervention and trauma counseling from a biblical prospective. Dr.

Marcell also serves as a psycho-social specialist and consultant to such organizations as World Vision in Uganda doing stress management training and individual counseling with staff.

Dr. Marcell is an international conference speaker/teacher, and has hosted and facilitated numerous workshops and seminars globally on such topics as missions, trauma counseling, and leadership/discipleship training. She is a mother of three children and grandmother of four. All reside in Tennessee in the U.S.
